WE DO

- Help people with a terminal illness or permanent disability enjoy their companion animals.
- Provide a monthly pet food and supplies food bank.
- Make regular home deliveries of pet food for clients with limited mobility.
- Provide for annual vaccinations for the companion animals of registered clients.
- Provide immediate service for registered clients.
- Recommend/coordinate spay/neuter services.
- Staff information tables at Broward, Dade or Palm Beach County locations
- Engage in outreach to educate the community.
- Outreach to educate the community and introduce potential clients to our services.
- Act as a source for information on Zoonoses, the Human-Animal Bond, and other educational concerns.

WE DO NOT

- Pay vet bills for clients. (We do refer people to agencies that could help)
- Provide services for individuals not currently registered as a The Pet Project client.
- Provide services for more than two pets per client.
- Provide services for animals that have been in the home for less than one year.
- Take animals to visit people in hospitals.
- Find homes for pets. (We only help to find a home for pets if the client passes away)
- Find homes for litters born to clients' pets. Client's pets are required to be spayed or neutered.
- Function as part of the SPCA or any other group. (Although we maintain open communication with other animal and AIDS organizations.)
- Receive funding from city, county, state, or federal government or any other social service.
